What Laureate Institute for Brain Research (LIBR) does with your personal Information.

Please read this Privacy Notice carefully to understand what we do.

Who?	The Laureate Institute for Brain Research (LIBR) is providing this notice.
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Why?	Regulations require us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personally identifiable information (PII) in order for researchers to be able to use or disclose your information.
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What?	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the research (referred to as a protocol) in which you participate with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medical history • Electroencephalography (EEG) • LIBR assessment data including, demographic and mental health test results • Tissue repositories, including saliva and blood samples • Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI)
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How?	All research institutions need to share participant information that facilitates their research initiatives. In the section below, we list the reasons LIBR shares participant information and whether you can limit this sharing.

We maintain your information and can continue to share your information as described in this notice. The authorization will never end, unless you revoke it. You can contact us at any time to limit our sharing. In doing so, we will mark your status accordingly within our systems. However, we will not be able to revoke any works or results where your information was already a contribution.</p>
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What we do	
How does LIBR protect my personal information?	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with national standards. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.
How does LIBR collect my personal information?	This information may be collected by the Principal Investigator and his staff, or provided by your physician, a hospital or an outpatient facility. We collect your personal information when you: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Give us your contact information • Complete our assessments • Undergo medical evaluations • Provide access to medical records
What does LIBR “Do” with my personal information?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • LIBR primarily uses your information for brain related studies where the collected information would benefit scientific research by the principal investigator and his staff. • LIBR develops new techniques in data analysis and data processing. • We use your data to assess the quality of the tools used in collecting your data, such as an MRI machine. • LIBR uses your information to research and develop commercial products either internally or with outside companies. • Researchers will present their study findings in scientific publications, meetings, and lectures. Limited private information may be displayed, such as a picture of your brain.
What does LIBR “Not Do” with my personal information?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • LIBR does not sell your contact information to anyone. • The researchers at LIBR will not individually identify you in their findings.

Definitions	
Participant Information	The information LIBR collects from you is collectively considered as the participant. The data is collected and used for analysis in order to answer a specific question bound by a Study or Research Protocol.
Study or Research Protocol	A study that has established a code of procedure used to support a research initiative.
Principal Investigator	The scientist conducting the research.
